










### **COLLEGE AND YOUNG ADULTS**

This fall we will launch re:generation, a discipleship program to find freedom from all of life's hurts, hangup, and habits. Over the course of 9 months, we will walk through the 12 steps of biblical healing in the context of authentic community. There is not a quick fix for life's brokenness. Instead, through consistent, committed discipleship based on God's Word, countless people have uncovered and found freedom from struggles like anxiety, substance abuse, codependency, pornography, eating disorders, pride, depression, fear, control, emotional/physical abuse, same-sex attraction, people pleasing, anger, and more.

Biblical Counseling has helped me recognize hidden sin patterns with a hopeful perspective, always pointing me to my deep need for Jesus. I have learned how much my thoughts affect my actions, and how to take them captive to the obedience of Christ. The impact has reached every area of my life – through abiding in God's promises, I am learning to combat lies and walk in freedom. Now I am even able to love others better and share with them what I have learned.


- Offering guidance and support from our pastors.

## God at Work - Stepping into a New Season

At the start of 2024, Belmont Heights faced a significant transition as their former pastor stepped down, leaving the congregation with just 30 regular attendees. Chandler Vannoy stepped in as Interim Pastor, and the church worked hard to connect with the surrounding West View neighborhood. Through prayer and engaging in the community they knew that God had more in store for Belmont Heights. Then, in April, Chandler had a realization while standing in the church parking lot and looking toward the University of Tennessee. This sparked the idea of intentionally reaching out to college students, who could, in turn, help engage with the local neighborhood.

As they considered this new approach, Belmont Heights was also searching for a new pastor, but none of the candidates seemed like the right fit. That's when Brandon Moore entered the picture. Brandon, who had experience revitalizing churches and was already planning a move to Knoxville with the Salt Network, shared a vision that aligned perfectly with Belmont Heights' new direction. With a Ph.D. in church revitalization and a background in replanting churches, Brandon was the ideal leader to help transition Belmont Heights into a thriving, studentfocused church.

Under Brandon's leadership, Belmont Heights is embracing a Family Church model, aiming to become autonomous while remaining closely connected with Rise865. In Summer 2025, they will officially replant as Calvary Commons. Attendance has already doubled. and with an additional 50-60 people preparing to move to Knoxville, momentum is building. This fall, they will launch a college ministry called The Salt Company, further cementing their focus on reaching students. The Belmont Heights community has fully embraced this vision, and with ongoing support from Rise865, they are stepping into an exciting new chapter of growth and renewal.

# God at Work - Reaching the Unreached

Earlier this year, we traveled to India, partnering with local teams to carry out important work. As our trip progressed, we ventured beyond the city into the countryside, focusing on a crucial mission—mapping unreached and unengaged people groups.

Our approach was simple but challenging. We rode motorcycles into remote villages, meeting locals and asking for any leads that could guide us to these elusive communities. At the same time, we prayed for opportunities to share the gospel, hoping that along the way, we might also find those we had been seeking.

We had been warned that success wouldn't come easily. Days passed without a single lead. Frustration grew, but on our last night at the hotel, we gathered in prayer, asking God for a breakthrough. With only a few hours left before we had to leave, we placed our faith in Him, hoping for something miraculous.

The next morning, we set out again, following a promising lead that our local partner had received the night before. Arriving at a village, we stopped to speak with a man, explaining who we were looking for. To our amazement, he responded, "I'm from that group." Hope surged. When we asked if others from his community lived nearby, he led us down an alleyway. As we turned the corner, a crowd began to emerge—men, women, and children pouring out of their homes. It was as if the man had told them that we had come bearing important news.

Then, something remarkable happened. A family moved their dinner table into the alley, offering us a place to sit. The entire community gathered around, eager to hear what we had to say.

Our national partner turned to me and said, "Share the gospel."

By the time we finished speaking, sixty people from this unreached group had gathered to hear the message many for the first time in their lives. And when we asked how many wanted to learn more, 75% of them raised their hands.

It was overwhelming. Just the night before, we had prayed for guidance, uncertain if we would ever find the people we were searching for. Now, we stood in the midst of them, witnessing a moment that only God could have orchestrated.



#### **OFFERING**


An offering is what is given above and beyond a tithe.
